

Mysteries of the World - Stonehenge

Activity 2

In the websites you looked at, there were several theories presented explaining the origins and purpose of Stonehenge. With your partner, you will be writing an article for publication within the school community. The article should contain information describing Stonehenge: what it is, how it was constructed, and the theories concerning its mysterious purpose.

Notes:

- take notes from the websites in point form and in your own words - do not copy word for word from the website!
- use this information to develop an article which informs a student audience about Stonehenge.
- if you feel one theory is more believable than another, you may argue for this theory in your article
- the article should be at least one page, single spaced
- you should include a title and both of your names
- you will need to include a bibliography which cites the websites where you found your information (see below)
- include your notes, good copy and bibliography when you hand in this assignment
- you may type or handwrite your final product

The following explains how you should cite your resources if citing a website:
Author's Last name, First initial. (date of publication or "NO DATE" if (unavailable)).
Title of article or section used [Online]. Available: complete U RL [date of access].
